Aynor Middle School SEMESTER 1 REPORT

This brand-new program has already led eight students to salvation and opened the minds and hearts of all enrolled

Think of this as halftime. The first semester for Horry County Schools is in the books, including the inaugural semester for the Coastal School Ministries (CSM) released-time Bible education classes at Aynor Middle School.

And we're in the locker room reviewing the highlights, while looking ahead to strategies for Aynor Middle School's second semester and beyond, with teacher Jamie Owens and Aynor CSM board member Randy Hilburn.

First-time teacher Jamie Owens shares how much the CSM ministry has become part of his life, even as early as the first few weeks into his first semester. Although he has 11 years experience in adult education, Owens never taught a class of middle schoolers. Regardless, he says that his mission in the classroom has always been "to bring children to the saving grace of Jesus and to strengthen the faith of those that have already come to Christ through a better understanding of His Word."

As you can imagine, that mission wasn't without its challenges. Some students, says Owens, were disruptive in the early days of the semester, but have grown in character and genuine interest in what the Bible has to say about their lives. "Now, they actively participate in lessons and many have come to me privately asking questions about salvation," he says.

Owens reports that, while there are students already saved, some know nothing about the Word and don't even have a Bible in their homes.

"The minds of these children at this age are so pliable and the enemy has led many astray through a vast array of media outlets," says Owens. "They need truth. They need God. When they hear the Bible taught, it affects them

and you can see it in their eyes. They want something real to hold on to. Many are going through tough situations and I praise God that Coastal School Ministries is reaching out to them with these classes.

"I have learned to obey the spirit and reach out to each class in a different way," he continues. "We must become all things to all men that some might be saved. We must adapt to their individual personalities and teach Jesus accordingly."

Owens is honored to have led eight students to salvation this semester, praying a sincere sinner's prayer with each one. He says, "Receiving Jesus as all their classmates watch is a task most adults would cower at, but with tears in their eyes, they stand up and publicly put their trust in Him."

Which is what Owens does every day: trusts in Him. He asks for continued prayers from the CSM community. "If



this country is to turn back to God, this is where it begins," he says. "Our young people need Jesus and I'm humbled and amazed that God has allowed this imperfect vessel to be a part of that ministry."

Aynor CSM board member Randy Hilburn, who has been on the ground floor of this program in Aynor Middle School, had the privilege of substitute teaching the class for Owens and witnessing God working within his students.

One class that particularly stands out to him was on a reading in Genesis (7:1-16) that tells of Noah and the Ark, that the "Lord shut them in the ark," and the direct correlation with John 10:9, in which Jesus says He is the door, or the only one way to heaven – just as there was only one way on the ark.

"One student really understood that because we had a direct discussion on the belief of the 'many' ways to heaven," says Hilburn. "Her response was, 'So we've been lied to?' and then followed up with, 'So Jesus is the only way.' That was a priceless moment to me."

That's one of the many rewards Hilburn shares: knowing that young lives have been impacted by the gospel of Jesus Christ. The hard work of Hilburn and fellow Aynor board members Clint Hardwick, Keely Adams and Danielle Skipper have certainly paid off, after contacting 40 churches and fellow Christians throughout the community about the priceless opportunities of this CSM ministry.

"Getting to meet new Christians and serving with some of the most gifted and passionate believers that I've ever met has been such a joy," says Hilburn.

To continue this program's path to righteousness for these impressionable students, Hilburn says they could use more believers in the Aynor area to sign up to substitute teach classes in case the primary teacher cannot for some reason, to drive the bus so the teacher can stay focused on classroom time, (It's only about a 400-yard trip and doesn't require a CDL driver's license.) and to serve as board members so they can propel this program into Aynor High School by finding the necessary financial support.
