She spoke to Lynn privately and thanked her. Dee said that the Bible class had an enormous impact on her life. She had come to understand a lot of things and now she is very excited to deepen her faith in the Lord.

I had been feeling discouraged in one of my classes. Students did not

There was Elijah, who quickly came running up to me, shook my hand, and flashed his trademark smile! Quite a reception, after recalling our first day together and despite not seeing him in about three months.

I asked him if he was looking forward to graduating from middle school in two days and preparing to attend high school in the fall. He excitedly said that he was, but he also made my day by saying that he wants to sign up to take the CSM Bible Class again in high school! He was very disappointed to learn he would have to wait until January 2020 because we only offer one semester of classes to each school.

It was great to see him and to be encouraged to see how much God had done in him this past year – to stick out those first couple of weeks together and now desire to return as soon as possible!
